WHAT’S GOING ON IN YOUTH MINISTRY

There are 8 components to Comprehensive Youth Ministry: Over the next month we’ll list two in every bulletin. We will be relying on the whole parish, Coordinated primarily by Ms. Stiefeman and the rest of the parish staff, to address each of these components:

1. **Advocacy:** interpreting the needs of youth and their families, especially the social problems facing them and acting with or on behalf of youth and their families for a change in the systems (policies, procedure, programs) which create or contribute to the social problems, giving young people a voice and empowering them to address the social problems that they face.

2. **Catechesis:** sponsoring youth toward maturity in Catholic Christian faith as a living reality through the kind of teaching and learning that emphasizes understanding, reflection, and transformation: fostering in youth a communal identity as Catholic Christians within the intergenerational community of faith and helping them to develop their own personal faith identity (The Challenge of Adolescent Catechesis).
