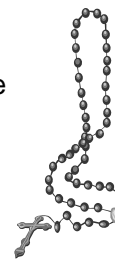

The Revised English Translation of the Mass: Music

When we begin praying the revised English translation of the Mass on the First Sunday of Advent, those texts which are usually sung (e.g., the *Sanctus*) will have new musical settings that fit the new texts. Sacred music and singing are an integral part of the solemn celebration of the Mass. In fact, anything that is prayed aloud can be sung, and the Church highly recommends that the prayers, greetings, etc. be chanted (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, nn. 39-41).

The new Missal itself contains settings of the *Gloria*, the Creed, the *Sanctus*, the Memorial Acclamation (which we are already learning), and the *Agnus Dei* that are based on the simplest of the Church's Gregorian chant settings of these texts. In our diocese, parishes will be using these basic chant settings for a year and will begin to learn other new settings after that.

Answers to our first two questions...

Why do you have to be confirmed to be a Baptism sponsor?
Baptism is the first step of a three stage initiation process in the Catholic Church; the other steps are Eucharist and Confirmation. If you are not yourself fully initiated, it is difficult for you to be the sponsor of another taking this initiation journey. If you wish to be the Baptismal sponsor, it is possible to be confirmed after a formation process to be determined by the pastor.

Do parents have to be married in the Church in order to have their child Baptized? The child can be Baptized in the Catholic tradition even though the parents have not had a church wedding. Though not an ideal situation, the Church never wants to discriminate against the child - or the parents - as good and faith-filled people. If interested, there is always the opportunity to have your marriage blessed in a special ritual.
