**Theme: Dealing With Injustice**

**First Reading: Isaiah 5:1-7** (*the vineyard song*)

**Second Reading: Philippians 4:6-9** (*joy and peace in Christ*)

**Gospel: Matthew 21:33-43** (*parable of the tenants*)

Jesus said, "Therefore I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit. (Matthew 21:43)

**Adult Question:** What would your reaction be if you found that someone you thought you could trust was taking money from you without your knowledge? How would you handle the situation?

**Child Question:** What would you do if you found out a friend had not been acting like they were your friend?

Saint Augustine, a doctor of the church, once wrote that the first, second, and third most important attitude in Christianity is humility. In today's second reading, Saint Paul is concerned with how we conduct ourselves in our community of faith. He urges us to let our conduct be worthy of the Gospel we say that we believe, and that it all begins with humility. He asks us to consider others better than ourselves and to serve them by looking out for their best interest, not ours. **Work Starts on Habitat for Humanity Build**

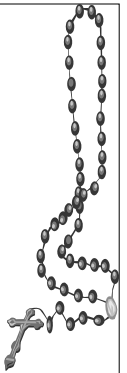
