"I.C." THE WORD
TWELFTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME
June 20, 2010

First Reading: Zechariah 12:10-11 (*messianic Jerusalem*)

Second Reading: Galatians 3:26-29 (*one in Christ Jesus*)

Gospel: Luke 9:18-24 (*followers of Jesus*)

Then Jesus said to them all, "If you want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me."

Adult Question: When have you faltered or looked back during your journey of faith?

Child Question: What can you do to be a stronger follower of Jesus this week?

Jesus asks his disciples, "Who do the crowds say that I am?" They respond with several names or possibilities. Then Jesus asks, "But who do you say that I am?" Now the question is personal. To answer they must reveal what is in their heart and head. Their answer will tell Jesus how they feel about him. Peter says: "You are the Christ of God." That took great faith and courage. The implications were enormous; Jesus wastes no time in bluntly telling them that the "Christ of God" was going to suffer; be rejected by the authorities; killed and rise on the third day." Jesus leaves nothing to the imagination. Then he adds what his closest friends were most afraid to hear: "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself, take up his cross daily and follow me." We may be relieved that we were not present with Jesus two thousand years ago. But Jesus is present with us today - in the Eucharist; in his Church. He asks each of us, "Who do you say that I am?" How do we answer him? Are we willing to accept the consequences?

A hundred thousand thank yous to all who came to share my joy in celebrating my golden jubilee as a priest. It was truly a blessing to greet so many former parishioners from Immaculate Conception, St. Peters, St. Joseph in Jefferson City, Immaculate Conception in Loose Creek, St. Anthony in Folk and St. Joseph in Westphalia, as well as those from other parishes. Thank you for the many cards and well wishes.

God continue to bless all of us as we continue to come to know and serve him. God bless.
