"Which one of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" He answered, "The one who treated him with mercy." "Rabbi, why do Jews always answer a question with a question?" The rabbi responded, "And why shouldn't we?" Jesus is a Jew. When the scholar of the (Jewish) law asked him, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus answered with a question, "What is written in the law?" The scholar quotes "You shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart, being, strength and mind ...and your neighbor as yourself." The scholar knew the law but he (a lawyer) looks for a loophole: "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus challenges us to want for our neighbor what we want ourselves. And everyone is our neighbor, no matter how unlovable they may be.
