SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME
July 25, 2010**

First Reading: Genesis 18:20-32 (*Abraham intercedes for Sodom*)

Second Reading: Colossians 2:12-14 (*sovereign role of Christ*)

Gospel: Luke 11:1-13 (*the Our Father*)

Jesus said, "So I say to you, 'Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you.'" (Luke 11:9)

Adult Question: Have your most recent prayers been of praise, petition, or sorrow? Which kind of prayer do you need to practice more often?

Child Question: What are you most thankful for right now?

"Lord, teach us to pray!" Luke 11:1-14

Abraham bargains to save Sodom. He starts out with fifty innocent people. God agrees. Obviously lacking confidence he will find fifty, he bargains God down to ten. He could not even find ten, so Sodom is destroyed. The Old Testament covenants were bargains with God. God always kept his part. The patriarchs and Israelites were not so faithful. The disciples saw Jesus as a person who was faithful to the Covenant and a man of prayer. They asked Him, "Lord, teach us to pray." He teaches them the Our Father. Then He tells the stories of the persistent woman and fathers who give their children bread and eggs, not snakes and scorpions. Are we confident when we pray to God, Our Father in heaven, that His Kingdom, not ours, will come; that His will, not ours, be done; for our daily bread not tomorrow's or next year's; and to forgive our sins as we forgive others? Are we good stewards who are persistent in prayer to learn God's will? Try prayer - and keep trying!

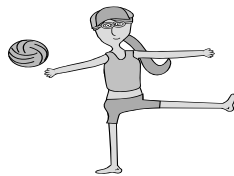
