TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME
August 22, 2010

First Reading: Isaiah 66:18-21 (*gathering of the nations*)
Second Reading: Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13 (*the discipline of God*)
Gospel: Luke 13:22-30 (*the narrow door*)

Jesus answered them, "Strive to enter through the narrow door; for many, I tell you, will try to enter and will not be able." (Luke 13:24)

Adult Question: What daily choices are you making that will allow you to be recognized at the doorway of the reign of God?

Child Question: What good habits are you practicing in order to be a good Christian?

"I do not know where you are from." Luke 13:22-30
What will we do if Jesus speaks those words to us when we finally meet him?
Will our faces go pale and our knees buckle? Will we be very frightened? Will we mumble, "I ate and drank in your company and you taught me"? What if Jesus ask us, "But what did you learn? Did you eat and drink in the company of the hungry, the homeless, the naked, the oppressed, the diseased? Do they know where you are from?" If people in need in our world know where we are from, Jesus will know where we are from. He will recognize us right away. He will be anxiously waiting for us to enter into his presence. ATTENTION IMMACULATA WOMEN! Church World Service needs **SCHOOL AND HYGEINE KITS**. **SCHOOL KITS:** one pair of blunt scissors (rounded tip), a 12 inch ruler, 1 hand held pencil sharpener, 1 large eraser, 6 new pencils with erasers, 1 box of 24 crayons, 3 - 70-count pads of 8 x 10 1/2 ruled paper or pads with 200 sheets of ruled paper (no loose-leaf paper)..and a 12 x14 to 14 x16 cloth bag with cloth handles. **Pack all items inside cloth bag.** Packing and shipping \$2 per kit. Many impoverished schools need these basic tools for learning! **HYGEINE KITS:** 1 hand towel measuring approximately 16 x 28 inches (no fingertip or bath towels); 1 washcloth, 1 wide-tooth comb; 1 nail clipper (no metal files or emory boards); one bar of bath soap in wrapper; 1 toothbrush (in original packaging); 6 band-aids (please do not add toothpaste). Seal all items in a one-gallon plastic bag with zipper enclosure. These simple kits can mean the difference between sickness and health for struggling families. Kits can be delivered to the rectory through September.
