**“I.C.” THE WORD**  
**26th SUNDAY of ORDINARY TIME**  
**September 25, 2011**

**Theme: The Challenge to Forge**

**First Reading:** Ezekiel 18:25-28 (*personal responsibility*)

**Second Reading:** Philippians 2:1-11 (*imitating Christ's humility*)

**Gospel:** Matthew 21:28-32 (*parable of the two sons*)

A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, “Son, go and work in the vineyard today.” He answered, “I will not”; but later he changed his mind and went. The father went to the second and said the same; and he answered, “I go, sir” but he did not go. Which of the two did the will of his father? They said, “The first.” (Matthew 21:28-31)

**Adult Question:** When have your actions not measured up to your promises? What was the outcome?”

**Child Question:** Why is it important to follow through on your promises to others?

Saint Augustine, a doctor of the church, once wrote that the first, second, and third most important attitude in Christianity is humility. In today's second reading, Saint Paul is concerned with how we conduct ourselves in our community of faith. He urges us to let our conduct be worthy of the Gospel we say that we believe, and that it all begins with humility. He asks us to consider others better than ourselves and to serve them by looking out for their best interest, not ours. Consider how Saint Paul's appeal to imitating Christ's humility can enhance your relationships
