Theme: Helping Others Grow

First Reading: Ezekiel 33:7-9 (*the prophet a watchman*)

Second Reading: Romans 13:8-10 (*love fulfills the Law*)

Gospel: Matthew 18:15-20 (*fraternal correction*)

Jesus said, If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone." (Matthew 18:15)

Adult Question: What have you been able to overcome because someone patiently loved you?

Child Question: How can you help another person do the right thing?

Am I my brother's Keeper? All three readings today suggest that for the Christian steward the answer is "Yes!" We are all sinners, yet, through all this, the one sinned against must forgive, no matter whether or not the sinner exhibits repentance. Christ makes that very clear in the Lord's Prayer, "...and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." There's no way around that, and we need to examine ourselves and our attitude toward those who have hurt us. There are many who block receiving forgiveness by refusing to offer it to others. Forgive those who have hurt you, and those who have refused your request for forgiveness.
