The "Kiss" of Peace

At mass we are often invited to "share some sign of Christ's peace." While it is traditionally referred to as the "Kiss of peace" (which married couples are encouraged to appropriately do), the custom in our time is a "handshake." However, the Church has not specified that sign, and there may be good reason for us to occasionally choose another sign: a bow of the head, a smile, or even the verbal exchange "peace be with you," or "Peace." Some instances to choose another sign may be, for instance, when we know we have a cold or aren't feeling well. Please be patient and charitable with each other, and do not perceive a hesitance to shake hands as negative and be prepared to share then, an alternate form of the sign of peace.
